The Chief will be expected to recruit additional faculty to support both laboratory and clinical research, to strengthen further an already strong clinical practice of the faculty, and to enhance the current competitive fellowship program. The Division currently has strong programs in Lung Transplantation, Pulmonary Hypertension (affiliated with the Wall Center), Cystic Fibrosis, Critical Care, and Interstitial Lung Disease.
