

# UCDAVIS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

## Department of Medical Pathology and Laboratory Medicine

The University of California, Davis, School of Medicine seeks a dynamic physician-leader as Chair for the Department of Medical Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. The successful candidate must have the ability to anticipate change and implement initiatives to meet the challenges of academic medicine and managed care, to work cooperatively and collegially within a diverse environment and should exhibit excellent interpersonal skills to build and maintain relationships with administration, trainees, and medical, nursing, and technical staff. Candidates must be board-certified in Anatomic Pathology and/or Clinical Pathology, have a distinguished record in teaching, clinical care, administration and/or research, and must meet requirements for appointment as Full Professor in one of the University of California's academic series. Eligibility for licensure in the state of California is also required.

The responsibilities of this position include the administrative oversight of the department's clinical services, training programs, research initiatives, budget and resource allocations. Vice-Chairs are available in research, education, and AP & CP for operational support. It is anticipated that the chair will devote the majority of his/her effort to administrative duties and university service. Clinical service and or research may also be expected based on the candidate's academic series. Teaching contributions are required.

The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine has over 30 faculty members, provides service in all major subspecialties of anatomic and clinical pathology, and is active in basic science, translational, and clinical research. Educational programs include a 14-person residency program and specialty fellowships in hematopathology, cytopathology, and surgical pathology. The University of California, Davis, Medical Center (UCDMC) and the School of Medicine (SOM) are located in Sacramento, the capitol of California, with a metropolitan population of 1.5 million people. UCDMC is a 576 bed academic medical center, with the distinction of having an NCI-designated Cancer Center and is one of the nation's "Top 100 Hospitals." In addition, Construction is being completed for a new addition which will add hospital beds, operating rooms and emergency treatment stations. Clinical affiliations exist with the adjacent Shriners Children's Hospital of Northern California; the Mather Veterans Administration Hospital, Sacramento, and the Travis Air Force Base, Fairfield, California.
